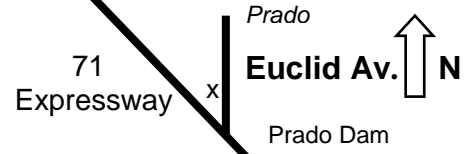

Rules & Policies (in brief)

General Rules are posted at the front entrance to the archery range and on a bulletin board by the practice area.

Members are required to wear club identification in plain view while on the range.

Common sense and safety rules must be followed at all times while on the range.

Gate Combination disclosure to non-members is prohibited. Period. Membership will be revoked.

Close the gate when you come inside during the week. We are open to the public only on Sundays.

- No alcoholic beverages during tournaments.**
- No glass bottles on the range.**
- No shooting broadheads into target bales.**
- No shooting at signs, or poles. Membership will be revoked.**
- No repetitive shooting at roving targets.**
- Use practice area bales only for regular shooting.**

Members also need to sign in on Public Sundays. This is for lease-use and insurance purposes.

No smoking on the range. Smoking is okay by the clubhouse and cook shacks. Please use the trash cans.

Our third Scalps N Skins Tournament is this month on the 22nd. It is also broadhead optional so ya can bring your hunting setup, even your range finder if ya like. This would be a good setup check for the State Broadhead the following weekend. There is nothing like knowing you are "good to go" for a tournament as big as this. Good luck to all who plan on attending.

The next subject I would like to address is "sky drawing". If you skydraw, you are pulling too much weight, PERIOD! Make your bow's draw weight more manageable, more comfortable. You won't be as tired and you will shoot better. The other benefit is not launching an arrow into outerspace not knowing where it has landed. Skydrawing is prohibited at the range at all times.

Last subject, Beer. There's probably not a guy or girl in the club that likes drinking beer at the range more than me. But I don't do it during a tournament out on the range, it is against our rules. At the last Tournament, our Big Game Shoot, we picked up over 3 CASES of beer cans and countless bottles on the range when we were picking up animals. That is ridiculous. Drinking on the range during a tournament is against our rules, not to mention, glass is also prohibited on the range.
